PROGRESSIVE ACHIEVEMENT TESTING (PAT) AT STJPII



Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT) are tests designed to asses the students learning achievements throughout the year. COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

Exposing children to domestic violence is emotional abuse. And that abuse has a range of negative consequences. Neglect and physical abuse also frequently occur along with the emotional abuse. Children who report high levels of exposure to violence (either as witness or victim) report the highest levels of depression, anger and anxiety. Some of them can become desensitised to violence and learn that it's normal. They may become more aggressive themselves. A Canadian study found that children who witnessed chronic parental violence were at greater risk of substance abuse. **READ MORE** >
