

Overview of the 2016 HSC and ATAR



- 75,825 students completed at least one HSC course.
- 3,811 did not complete any ATAR course.
- 72,014 remaining pool 90.4% received an HSC 77.7%.
- 55,956 or 77.7% students received an ATAR.
- 9 students received an ATAR but not eligible for HSC.
- 10.1% of students took at least one language.
- 93.4% receiving an ATAR only included 2016 courses.
- 46.3% completed only 10 units, 31.7% more than 10 units.

Overview of the 2016 HSC and ATAR



- 55,956 students ATAR eligible in 2016 53.3% were female.
- 16.5% received an ATAR of 90.00 or above.
- Median ATAR for 2016 was 68.65.
- Median ATAR – females, 70.45. males, 66.55.
- The 99.95 ATAR group studied 40 different courses out of the 118 courses offered.
- 46 students in the 99.95 group – 13 females and 33 males.
- 10% of male students are less likely to attempt HSC studies.
- 16.7% have no math.
- HSC eligible no math – 29.7% female 17.4% male.
- ATAR eligible no math – 23.1% females 9.3% male.
- 50488 Year 12 applicants 2016 down 1.6% from 2015 or 828.

- For the Main round there were **19,762** EAS applications a decrease of **970** or **4.9%** from the previous year.
- Virtual **12,669** decrease of **703** or **5.6%** from 2015.
- Paper **7,234** decrease of **267** or **3.7%** from 2015.
- 442 not eligible down on 2015.

Schools Recommendation Schemes - SRS



- 9,804 applicants from 910 schools in 2016, an increase of 1,013 or 11.5% from 2015.
- 8,756 NSW SRS applicant or 11.2% of the NSW cohort.
- 2,073 SRS applicants also submitted an EAS application (21.1%).
- 39 SRS applications not rated and completed.
- Total offers – 12,093.
- Total offers for NSW students – 10,858.

IMPORTANT

- Must be full legal name.
- Must registered with school and NESA.
- Same as shown on birth certificate or passport.



Educational Access Schemes - EAS



- Year-round applications.
- On-time closing **29 September**.
- Submit by **30 November** for notification of eligibility before COP of main round offers.
- Eligibility letters will be out **Tuesday 12 December** before ATAR release.
- Changes to schools lists see UAC website.
- **202** school changes, **76** schools removed all together.
- List of disadvantaged schools at www.uac.edu.au/eas

Changes to EAS



H01C - Home environment due to parental separation

- is about the separation of parents and its effects.
- EIS required from school and must include dates.

P01A - Long term medical

- rehab for injuries that are less than 2 hours per week not eligible even if for six months or more.

Ro1A Refugee status

- current refugee status either onshore or offshore.
- visa must clearly show subclass.

Schools Recommendation Schemes - SRS...



- Early offers using criteria other than or in addition to ATAR.
- Application – online through UAC - SRS Apply.
- No additional application charge.
- On-line application must be submitted by 29 Sept.
- Applications are open to all students.
- Not all courses are available.

Changes to SRS 2017-18

- No awards or achievements from students.
- SRS Offers released from November 16 2017.

Selection Rank



$$\text{SELECTION RANK} = \text{ATAR} + \text{BONUS POINTS} + \text{ADDITIONAL SELECTION CRITERIA}$$

ATAR

- For most HSC students, your selection rank = your ATAR

Bonus Points

- Bonus points and EAS points can change your selection rank for a specific course at a particular institution.
- Bonus points DO NOT change your ATAR
- There are three types of bonus points
 - Subject bonus
 - Regional bonus
 - EAS

Additional Selection Criteria

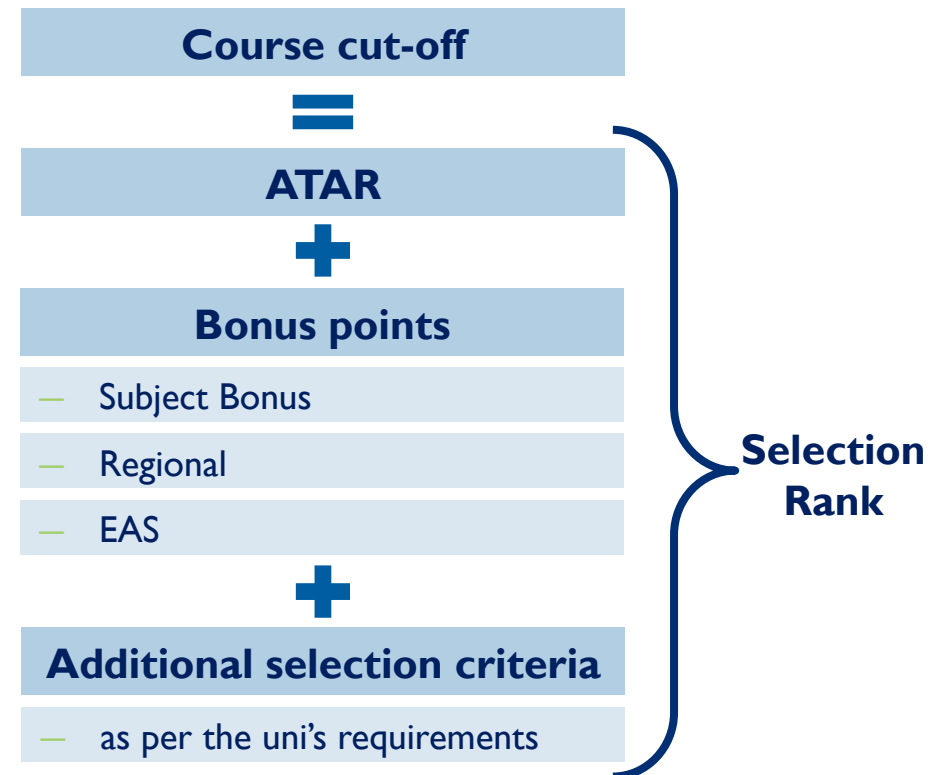
- Some courses may have additional selection criteria (i.e. interview or portfolio)

Course Cut-offs

The cut-off for a course is the minimum selection rank needed by most Year 12 applicants for selection into a course.

COURSE CUT-OFF
=
MINIMUM SELECTION RANK

**Remember, the course cut-off
is not an ATAR cut-off!**



Preferences and Offers...



- Should be in order of preference not highest cut-off.
- Preferences can be changed as many time as a student wants at no extra charge.
- Check 'change of preference' closing dates between offer rounds.
- One offer per offer round if eligible.

Accepting offers...

- UAC recommends that students accept any offer that has been given as there is no guarantee of another offer.
- Accepting an offer doesn't stop other offers from being made.
- Remember that for another offer to be made students must take any previous offer from their list for all preference to be considered in the next offer round.
