To Parents/Caregivers of our Year 9 students,

We are writing to inform you about our Year 9 differentiated novel study for 2017. The textbook list issued for Year 9 had “TBC” under textbooks for English, attached to this letter are the options for our novel study. Students are required to have one of these novels by Week 6 (29 May) at the latest.

In 2015/2016 Year 8 were introduced to a differentiated novel study that allowed students to have choice in their reading and study novels of varying difficulties, we are continuing with this approach with 4 novels on the list. This term students will be completing the concept unit of ‘Journeys’ and will be required to purchase a novel to commit to, and read throughout this unit of study. Reading will be taking place in and out of the classroom and for this reason, students will be bringing home a reading schedule to ensure students follow timelines. Processes will be set up in the classroom to support this approach such as; reading logs, matrix activities, cooperative learning opportunities, guided reading and literature circles.

Provided on the following pages are the details of the four novels set for study for the Journey unit. Students are required to have one of these novels for the start of week 6 of this term. If there is a problem with organising the purchase of a novel please let the LCF – English, Mrs Anya Meek, Miss Kirsty Bell or your child’s classroom teacher know as soon as possible.



