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From the Principal - Mr Fanning

Excellent learning and teaching has been occurring during Term 3. For many students in Years 7 and 9 this was reflected in their NAPLAN results. Our Year 12 students have now completed their Trial HSC examinations and are moving onto the next phase of their journey as they prepare for their upcoming graduation ceremonies followed by the HSC examinations shortly afterwards. At the same time Bodies of Work for practical subjects are being finalised for marking as are the major performances for the creative and performing arts. Some subjects have already been marked by NESA markers.

We have now accepted 190 applications for Year 7 in 2018. Taking into account the increase of schools in our area this is great testimony to the trust our community places in us to provide our students with the best education possible. If you are aware of any families who have not made application for next year please advise them to contact Mrs Fay Lovett on 92087205 at the college as a matter of urgency to avoid the possibility missing out on enrolment for their son/daughter.


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WATCH: YEAR 7 MEDIEVAL DAY

COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

Here's another drop in the ocean of words related to the same-sex marriage debate. This drop focuses on the mental health of young people who see themselves as LGBTIQ+ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, queer). Here at school and across the country students are coming out to their peers. And often their peers are more accepting and supportive than would have been the case in only the recent past. You probably know that LGBTIQ+ young people are at increased risk of mental health problems. You may also have heard that this higher risk is due in large part because of stigma, bullying, rejection, and judgment.
